Abstract Guidelines

- Attendees are invited to submit abstracts in either basic or clinical areas related to systemic sclerosis.
- Abstracts should report original investigations. Case reports will not be accepted.
- A limited number of Workshop awards will be available to fellows and junior faculty with the highest ranked abstracts. (See 'Travel awards for young investigators').
- Abstracts should be submitted to the Workshop by email to: millie.williams@ucl.ac.uk
- **Submission deadline – 12 June 2019**
- **Abstracts will be reviewed by the Abstract Select Committee.**
- You will receive an email notification of your abstract acceptance (oral and poster presentations).
- For oral presentations, the abstract author will be asked to give a 10 minute presentation (7 minute talk/3 minutes for questions)
- Standard poster size: 1m x 1m
- Poster display boards: 1m x 1m (Mounting fixatives will be available)

Format

- The abstract should be a **maximum of 350 words**.
- Text should be in Arial 10-point font only and presented in the following format:
